Our RE lessons will begin by reflecting on how through Baptism Christians are called to a life of holiness and how that this may be lived out in different ways. We will reflect on how for some it will be through marriage. We will also complete work on how Advent is a time of waiting in joyful hope for Jesus both at Christmas and at the end of time.		Our fiction work in English will focus on stories with historical settings. Our primary text will be an abridged version of Oliver Twist. We will complete various reading activities on the text as well as exploring the central themes of the story. The children will write their own follow up to Oliver Twist. We will also read A Christmas Carol.		Our mathematics lessons follow the Power Maths scheme. Year 5 will complete work on multiplication and division. They will then complete two units on fractions. Year 6 will complete work on long multiplication and long division before moving on to work on fractions.		
Science		Computing		Geography/History		
Our science lessons will be based around animals, including humans with a focus on describing the changes humans develop from birth to old age. Lessons will focus on the human timeline, how we change into adults and then how does the human and animal lifespan compare.		In computing lessons, the children will complete work on programming with a focus on micro:bit. We will clip blocks together in a program and predict what will happen. We will create animations, recognise inputs/outputs and break programs down into smaller steps.		Our focus for this half term will be on geography. Our unit of work will be a comparison of a region of the UK, Europe and North America. We will focus on the following: the Lake District, Tatra mountains (Poland) and the Blue Mountain (Caribbean).
