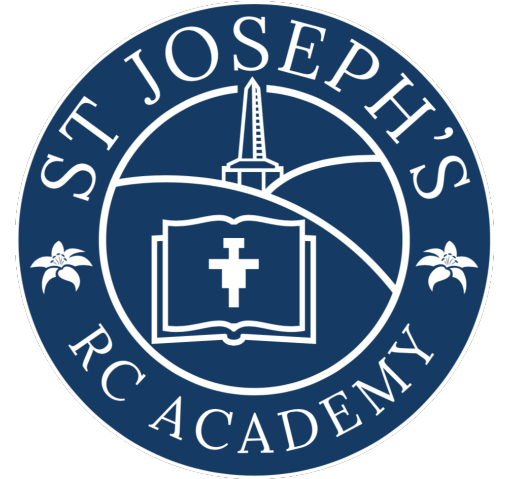


St Joseph's Family Project

Create a mini dictionary with definitions of the words and use each word in a sentence.</p>	<p>Find out about the author of the book. Find some facts out about the author or think of some questions you would like to ask the author.</p>	<p>Pick your favourite part of the book and create an illustration.</p>
<p>Draw your favourite character from the book.</p>	<p>If you were going to give a gift to a character from the book, what would it be? Draw a picture of the gift and explain why you chose this gift.</p>	<p>Design a new book cover.</p>	<p>Create a storyboard with 6 sections for the book.</p>
<p>Design a poster for the book to persuade other people to read the story.</p>	<p>Make a model of one of the characters.</p>	<p>Create a collage of the book. You could use doodles, drawings, and words to represent characters and events from the story.</p>	<p>Write a letter to a character in the book. What would you like to share? What would you like to ask?</p>
<p>Write a different ending for the book.</p>	<p>Draw and describe a setting from the book.</p>	<p>Complete a book review.</p>	<p>Imagine you are peeking through the keyhole of a scene in the story. Draw what you can see.</p>
